REMINDER: Please help us maintain the condition of our course by repairing ball marks and replacing your divots. **Please try to replace** your divot as opposed to just sanding the cavity. If your divot can be replaced, please sand around the cavity edges. We also have installed entry and exit posts. Please go beyond the entry post before entering the fairways and return to the cart path at the exit post.

Course Notes

all has arrived, and we are winding down another golfing season. There are still plenty of good golfing days remaining, so don't put away the gear just yet.

2019 has had its ups and downs. We are constantly striving for each year to be better than the year before, and this was a challenging year in the Commonwealth, to say the least. Weather in the "transition zone" proved to be difficult. We're slowly getting caught back up, just in time for leaf season.

Greens and tees had few or no issues this year, and we have a few cultural activities planned for them prior to putting them to bed for the winter. Our primary focus, as we move through the balance of the fall and into the winter, is in the fairways and the roughs. We have done a tremendous amount of over-seeding throughout and are still going back into areas of need and hitting those spots by hand. We are getting some very good results from this, and time will allow

these areas to begin fattening up. I appreciate everyone's help during this time by avoiding these spots with carts and traffic.

We still struggle with getting water in the roughs and keeping it off the fairways. Most of the course still has only one head that does both, and this year, we will continue to change out more of those heads. These new heads allow us to adjust them to throw out into roughs or 360 degrees. Moving forward, we plan to continue switching these heads out and eventually change them all. This is not the perfect solution, but it's helpful.

A contractor is scheduled to begin fairway aerification this late fall/winter. We still plan on aerifying the roughs this fall, if time and weather allow. Fairway top-dressing will begin after the first of the year; this will continue to improve the surface, but we can get some sand into the profile as well.

Soil samples have been pulled, and when we get our results back, we'll make whatever

adjustments and application necessary.

Water management continues to be our highest priority, but we're not yet satisfied. The new heads, improving our soils, and continuing with our cultural activities are steps in that direction.

Remember that as the grass begins to slow down, so does its recovery. Please fix ball marks, and when replacing divots, step them down firmly, because the leaves are falling, and the blowers will be everywhere cleaning them up. Please be reminded that divots should be replaced when possible. Only sand if necessary, and, if sanding, please drag out with your foot. Many are just dumping the sand in and leaving a pile. This is very difficult on the mowers and just adds to our maintenance costs.

Russell and Petunia are doing well. They are getting excited about pumpkins this year! Feel free to bring down fresh pumpkins for the pigs, big or small, and any color is fine.

From the pastures:

All the horses are doing well. Living life to the fullest; fat and happy! Dr. Novak will be visiting the barn to give all the horses a fall wellness exam and fall vaccinations.

During this time, dental exams will also be done if the horses need it. All our horses are checked once a year for any dental abnormalities. Our farrier, Montie Jefferson, will also be visiting the barn for the six-week farrier visit. All the horses will be dewormed this November. The horses are dewormed four times per year: February, May, August and November.

The barn is open daily for visitors and rides. Please call a day ahead of time to schedule a ride. If you have any questions regarding the barn or services offered, please call or email me. The barn offers full stall board and pasture board, along with ring rides, lessons, trail rides, birthday parties and private barn parties.

Horse Facts:

- I. Why do we mount horses from the left?
- *This dates back to Ancient Europe, when gentlemen carried swords. The swords were usually carried on the left side of the body so the man could draw the sword with his right hand. Therefore, in order to get on the horse unhindered by the sword, he had to mount on the left side. *Makes you wonder if left-handed men mounted on the right??
